The Educational program was presented by, Richard L. He had a great slide show of his trip to Potosi, Bolivia. He saw the ancient mines at Cerro Rico, it was reported this mine contained the most silver in the world. The first possible mint in this country was here and dated to be 1572-1770. They had a second mint dated 1770-1953. The second mint interestingly enough was operated by a steam engine, fueled by Llama poop! Starting in 1954 Bolivian coins have been minted at various locations including: US Denver mint (and during WWII). It was a very interesting presentation of history of his ancient city and their contribution to the world of coins.

There was a raffle of two coins.
