Several members had some great Show and Tell items. Kevin, Danny, Jack and Robert all had interesting information to share.

This evening's educational program was presented by Jack Gilbert. He spoke about MPC's (Military Payment Certificates). He has a very comprehensive collection of these. He has also attended a class thru the ANA in Colorado Springs. This currency was generated by the US for WWII issuing the HAWAII overprints which were released in July 1942. From then to the end of the war, several types of money were issued by the US. These currencies were all interim measures to either protect the economy of the US or an ally or to assist in the accomplishment of military objectives. The greatest need for this money was in Germany, there were a lot of American soldiers stationed there. In this case, they were paid in Allied military marks. The US was redeeming far more marks than were being disbursed each month. This caused a deficit (overdraft) of \$530,775,440! MPC's were in used up to the Vietnam War when they were totally withdrawn in 1973.

The club held a coin raffle.
