EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

Frank H. gave a really interesting program on the Chicago World's Fair Columbian Exposition of 1893. It was held from May through October of that year and over 26 million people attended. The fairgrounds included more than 670 acres and showcased the first

Ferris wheel and the first widespread use of electricity, which most American's had not seen yet.

Frank said the event had more paraphernalia associated with it than any other exposition and he had examples of quite a few items from it (bolstered by Richard L.'s collection) including books, maps, spoons, china, tickets and, of course, coins.

There were six official general admission tickets which looked more like small currency. Organizers had to keep printing new ones because demand was greater than expected. Frank had all six which contained the likenesses of Columbus, Washington, Lincoln, an Indian chief, Franklin and, the sixth issue, Handel, the composer.
